
Did You Know: In and Around Sussex County - Part 1


High Point State Park is the ideal place to go swimming, boating, fishing, hunting, and camping. Also known for being New Jersey's highest peak reaching a height of 1,803 feet above sea level. It sounds fascinating right! That is not all, Franklin D. Roosevelt was in charge of the CCC developing High Point State Park during the 1930s. CCC which stands for Civilian Conservation Corps is known to be a work relief program. Men who didn't have jobs benefited from this during the Great Depression since it gave them employment. Three billion trees were planted by the CCC, and they are responsible for the state parks, High Point State Park was a gift by Colonel Anthony and Susie Kuser in 1923. The project of High Point State Park was completed by the CCC, by doing the layout of the park from 1933 to 1941. Want more information? There is a book by Peter Osborne called High Point State Park and the Civilian Conservation Corps.

Peanut allergies are the most common type of allergies, 0.6% of Americans have peanut allergies in the United States. The biggest misconception about peanut allergies is people with them will be fine if avoid eating peanuts. Unfortunately, that is only one level of peanut allergies, some people are allergic by touch. Meaning, they are unable to touch a peanut in any way or they will get an allergic reaction. There is a range of allergic reactions, it could go from a runny nose to anaphylactic shock which can kill a person unless they don't use an EpiPen right away. Nearly 4% of people with peanut allergies are allergic by touch, making this very rare, but very real. Some ways to keep kids safe at school are implementing a peanut-free zone table at lunch or checking all ingredients in a classroom treat or even snacks in their lunch boxes. Reactions can come suddenly and unexpectedly, which makes them more harmful. So, be aware of classmates' and students' allergies so we can prevent all possibilities.




What's the Up with Plastic Straws?



GumBall Machine:




White t-shirt, pompoms, red pants, cardboard, silver paint and paper.get your

Recipes



Apple Pie from Scratch

Pie Crust

- 2 ½ cups of flour
- 1 teaspoon of salt
- ¾ cup butter, 11/2 sticks, cold, cubed
- 8 tablespoons ice water, or as needed

Filling

- 2 ½ pounds granny smith apples, cored, sliced, peeled
- ¾ cup sugar
- 2 tablespoons flour
- ½ tablespoon salt
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon




1. In a medium-sized bowl, add the flour and salt. Mix with fork until combined.
2. Add in cubed butter and break up into flour with a fork. Mixture will still have lumps about the size of small peas.
3. Gradually add the ice water and continue to mix until the dough starts to come together. You may not need all of the water, but if the dough is too dry then add more. The dough should not be very sticky.
4. Work the dough together with your hands and turn out onto a surface. Work into a ball and cover with cling wrap. Refrigerate.
5. Peel the apples, then core and slice.
6. In a bowl, add the sliced apples, sugar, flour, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg, and juice from the lemon.
7. Mix until combined and all apples are coated. Refrigerate.
8. Preheat the oven to 375°F (200°C).
9. On a floured surface, cut the pie dough in half and roll out both halves until round and about ⅛-inch (3 mm) thick.
10. Roll the dough around the rolling pin and unroll onto a pie dish making sure the dough reaches all edges. Trim extra if necessary.
11. Pour in apple filling mixture and pat down.
12. Roll the other half of the dough on top.
13. Trim the extra dough from the edges and pinch the edges to create a crimp. Make sure edges are sealed together.
14. Brush the pie with the beaten egg and sprinkle with the sugar.
15. Cut four slits in the top of the pie to create a vent.
16. Bake pie for 50-60 minutes or until the crust is golden brown and no greyish or undercooked pastry remains.
17. Allow to cool completely before slicing.
18. Top with ice cream (optional) and serve.

Pumpkin Fluff Dip and Glitter Candy Apples

Ingredients

- 1 can of pumpkin (15 or 16 oz)
- 1 container of cool whip (8oz)
- 1 package of vanilla pudding (3.4oz box)
- 1 tbsp pumpkin pie spice

Instructions

Combine all ingredients in a bowl and mix

Enjoy w/ pretzels or gram crackers

Serve in a bowl or in a pumpkin

Optional, add more cool whip, sprinkles, M&MS, pumpkin pie spice, or cinnamon for the finishing touch



Ingredients

- 4 Granny Smith Apples
- 2 cups Jolly Rancher candies, separated by color (about 50 each per batch)
- Edible glitter, any color you like
- 4 wooden sticks
- Nonstick cooking spray

Preparation

Preheat your oven to 350 degrees. Line a baking sheet with wax paper and coat with a nonstick cooking spray of your choice. Wash and dry apples, removing stems. Then insert a sturdy wooden stick into the top of each apple. Pour edible glitter into shallow bowl, heat-safe baking dish. Unwrap Jolly Ranchers candies (you'll need at least 50 or more) and place them into an oven safe bowl with a handle. Heat in the oven for about 15 minutes until candy starts to liquefy. Stir gently to avoid bubbles and return to oven for 3 to 4 minutes. Remove liquid candy from the oven and dip one apple at a time into the mixture. Allow excess candy to drip from apple for about 10 seconds since you don't want the coating to be too thick! Roll the apple in the edible glitter to create a star-spangled effect. Place the candy-coated apple onto greased wax paper and let harden (they should be cool and really to sever in 20 minutes). The candy mixture will begin to harden again, so place it back into the oven for about 3 minutes before repeating with next apple. Repeat process with different colors and enjoy!




