






For the iPhone 11, Apple also created QuickTake which makes it easier to record videos by long-pressing the camera button. The iPhone 11 comes in the colors purple, yellow, green, black, white, and red. In addition to the iPhone 11, Apple also released the iPhone 11 Max and the iPhone 11 Pro, which both have 3 cameras. 

Deluxe Cornbread Stuffing

Ingredients

- 6 cups crumbled cornbread
- 2 cups white bread cubes, toasted
- 1 cup chopped pecans
- 1/4 cup minced fresh parsley
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon rubbed sage
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1 pound bulk pork sausage
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 large tart apples, diced
- 1 cup diced celery
- 1 medium onion, finely chopped
- 1-3/4 to 2-1/4 cups chicken broth



1. In a large bowl, combine the bread, pecans and seasonings; set aside. Crumble sausage into a large cast-iron or other ovenproof skillet; cook over medium heat until no longer pink, breaking into crumbles. Remove with slotted spoon; drain on paper towels.

2. Add butter to drippings; saute the apples, celery and onion until tender. Add to bread mixture; stir in sausage and enough broth to moisten.

3. Spoon mixture into cast-iron skillet; cover and bake at 350° for 45 minutes. Uncover and bake just until set, about 10 minutes

- 6.) Use the red icing for the gobbler and yellow icing for the eyes.

S.T.E.M and Green Team Sponsored Assemblies




Movie and Game Review




Photography Spotlight






The Wallkill River National Wildlife Refuge

The Wallkill River National Wildlife Refuge is an important program that is managed by the US Fish and Wildlife Program. It has 6,000 acres of woods, animals and many other amazing living things. It has more than 260 species of birds and it has some endangered turtles, the bog turtle being one. There are amazing trails to explore to see the animals. Some trails may be 2.5 miles long, and include some parts of Cherry Valley. The main trail is the Wood Duck Trail. Other trails include the Loop Trail, the Dagmar trail, the Timberdoodle Trail, and the Waters Trail. 

The Archery in Motion, Reels on Wheels, and Kids in Kayaks programs were developed in 2016, by the Lenape Complex U.S Fish and Wildlife Service. These programs were developed to give kids and adults an opportunity to enjoy some outdoor activities without having to travel far. The Ogdensburg physical education teacher, Mr. Hornyak, was able to reach out to Mr. Lenhart (one of the workers from the U.S Fish and Wildlife Service) to ask if we could borrow one of the trailers for a week. Ogdensburg School was the first location to have the Aim trailer for a week, it usually remains a day in other places, and sometimes the workers stay the day with the trailer if they can. This time, Mr. Lenhart experimented to see if our school could handle having the AIM trailer for a week since Ogdensburg School had a good reputation. When Mr. Lenhart picked up the trailer he saw it was in perfect condition, and he is glad he trusted our school.

Here are the three programs that the U.S Fish and Wildlife Service offer...

AIM: This is the trailer that includes all of the archery supplies which contain the following: ten right-handed compound bows, four left-handed compound bows, arrows, targets, and a blow-up archery range.

ROW: This is the trailer that includes all of the fishing supplies which contain the following: forty loaner spin and pushrods, four fly rods, and a cooler that contains hooks, lures, bait, bobbers, and more.

KIK: This is the trailer that includes all of the supplies to go kayaking with eleven people which contains the following: kayaks, paddles, life vests, dry bags, waterproof cases, first aid kits, and a life preserver.






County Spotlight

Save the Bog Turtles

Have you ever heard of a tiny turtle that may be going extinct? That is the bog turtle, which lives in New Jersey and other parts of the Eastern United States. The bog turtle is going extinct because of illegal collecting and habitat loss. There are less than 2,000 bog turtles in the state of New Jersey. The regular bog turtle size is 3-3.5 inches. It rarely gets to 4 inches. The bog turtle is also called the *Glyptemys muhlenbergii*. The female bog turtles lay eggs in the soggy marsh.

The bog turtle in New Jersey lives mostly in Sussex, Warren, Hunterdon and Salem Counties. In 2001, in New Jersey, there were 168 known bog turtle habitats and 28 of them were known as metapopulations, which means that there were two or more populations that were interconnected. Locally, the Walkill Valley National Wildlife Refuge is helping to save the bog turtles by building and protecting their habitats. You can help too by helping rebuild their habitats and stopping illegal collecting of these tiny turtles!

- Scissors
- Glue Gun or regular glue



Step 1: Grab your vase


Step 2: Grab your rope and glue gun or regular glue.

Step 3 Start from the center of the vase on the bottom and bring the rope to the side of the vase and start wrapping the vase with the rope.

Step 4: As you are wrapping the rope around your vase, glue the rope to the vase.

Step 5: If you have extra rope when you reach the top of the vase, you can cut the rope off.

Step 6: Now you can put the candle inside of your vase and watch your DIY come to life.

Leaf Jars

Materials

- Mason Jars
- Leaves (fake or real)
- Modge Podge
- Sponge Brush (optional)
- Rubbing Alcohol



Step 1- Get all your materials together

Step 2- Make sure the outside of the jar is clean by rubbing off all grease on the outside with rubbing alcohol. Bend the leaves slightly to loosen them up. If you use real leaves you want to dampen them first.
Step 3: Dip your brush in Modge Podge and paint a thin layer on one section of the jar. Once the section is quite sticky (checky by dabbing with your finger) place a leaf in the jar.

Step 4: After, put another thin layer of Modge Podge to paint on top of the leaf making sure to smooth out the edges. Smooth the edges by starting with your fingers in the center and push your way out to the edges.

Step 5: Repeat these steps until you fill the jars surrounding inside with leaves. It may take more than one layer for the leaves to stick, don't be afraid to use your fingers.

Step 6: Decorate the outside of the jar with twine tied in a bow on the front. Place a candle on the inside to have your final product.




